

how we will speak of adoption in our home

In our house, we plan to speak openly and honestly about adoption and create positivity around it.

From the age that our child is old enough to understand, we will do our best to explain what adoption is and where they came from. We will explain how you, the birth parents, made your decision out of love and how blessed we are to be our child's parents.

We plan to have age appropriate conversations with our child to give them the information they need to hear and build their self esteem. We will always talk with confidence and pride so the child is never fearful to ask questions or think of adoption as an undesirable topic.

Using Kyle's experience of being supported similarly by his parents regarding his own adoption, we believe this creates the best situation for the child to develop their identity, confidence, and most of all feel loved.

If you as the birth parents choose to be involved in our child's life (which we hope you will) we will foster an open dialogue and relationship between you and our child. We would welcome discussions with you on what information each party is comfortable sharing about the process of becoming a family like ours. In our opinion, what matters most in all of this is the child.

As the opening quote in this book read, "a family is built and maintained through love." Based on our experiences, we agree wholeheartedly with this and look forward to extending our family further with lots of love.
